Students should provide a handout (one page) for the seminar participants, summarising their motivation, research question(s) and main (preliminary) results. The handout has to be uploaded to Moodle before the presentation and to be sent to Prof. Hein.

A student discussant will be the first to comment on the presentation (3 minutes). The discussant should receive the powerpoint presentation at least two days in advance of the presentation (as a pdf). The pdf also has to be sent to Prof. Hein.

Master students are required to attend at least six meetings (including their own presentation). Attendance is in person. Online attendance only after permission by Prof. Hein.
