Master students are supposed to present the motivation, research question(s), research methods and procedure, and also the **preliminary results** of their Master thesis. For the students we will have 15 minutes for the presentation and 15 minutes for the discussion each.

Students have to provide a handout (one page) for the seminar participants, summarising their motivation, research question(s) and **main (preliminary) results**. The summary has to be uploaded to Moodle before the presentation, together with a pdf of the presentation slides.

A student discussant will be the first to comment on the presentation (3 minutes). The discussant should receive the one page summary and the powerpoint presentation at least two days in advance of the presentation (as pdfs). The pdfs also have to be sent to Prof. Hein.

Master students are required **to attend at least eight meetings** (including their own presentation). Online presentation and participation is possible for EPOG students who are not in Berlin.
